School Violence Prevention/Violence Intervention Policies and Procedures

The district has implemented several district-wide policies that are being used to address school safety.

- To ensure a safe environment, all campus visitors are required to get passes from the office before going to other parts of the buildings.
- A computer check in system continues on all campuses, providing a complete record of visitors to the campus. Drivers license are now being scanned for check against a sex offender data base.
- Each campus conducts at least 2 emergency drills each month. Tabletop scenarios discussed during faculty meetings once a month.
- The district staff has been trained in student sexual harassment and child abuse issues.
- Mandatory drug testing for participants in extra-curricular school activities and drivers was still in place for the 2008-2009 school year for all secondary students.
- Drug awareness programs continue to be implemented district-wide that include activities during Red Ribbon Week and through the D.A.R.E. program.
- Training of the TBSI. Non-violent Crisis Intervention was made available to District employees.
- The Emergency Operations Manual is updated each year.

Our district is continuing to study and implement safe school policies and procedures. We are also continually seeking ways to involve our staff, students, parents and the community in our effort to have a positive safe school environment.

Evaluation of S.D.F.S.C.A.

The money allocated through the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act (S.D.F.S.C.A.) was used for drug awareness and self-esteem activities, and Interquest Detective Canine Service.

Campuses participated in Red Ribbon Week activities, attended anti-drug and self-esteem building assembly programs, participated in Rock Solid Character program and have the use of a drug dog service.

As a result of the S.D.F.S.C.A. funds, various activities have assisted us in being able to report 0 criminal or violent issues.
